CAIRO: The painting professor at the Faculty of Fine Arts, Wael Darwish opens his new art exhibition at Art Sawa in Dubai on Tuesday at 7 pm, under the name of “Disappearance...continued.”

Darwish described the concept of his exhibition in a statement to Youm7, saying, “Because of the blurry situations we witness everyday regarding the daily events we experience, this lead to the

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disappearance of each of us behind their thoughts and opinions without considering others' opinions or even hiding from ourselves. This is why we seek the way to find peace within our souls.”

“When our lives turned into so many speculations that changed everyone’s lives and changed their surroundings, we became insincere with each other,” he continued.

“We cannot expect what will happen the next minute; this is because we lost our transparency with ourselves. This transparency that no longer exists in our spiritual world, this is related to the blurriness that we witness these days due to the conflicts we live in, so our ability to solve the problems caused by such conflict, would represent the key to the secret and the solution for the mystery,” added Wael.

He also said that the sensual experience for the desire to stay invisible all the time expresses the way many human beings think and act. They are unclear and suspicious, due to the lack of purity of some people who are hiding. His paintings attempt to visually express these contradictory feelings.

The artworks have a dramatic aspect, in addition to an emotional sense. This is emphasized by the state of mystery, as well as the potential freedom that is obvious through the emotional and sensual energy radiating from the artworks, Darwish told Youm7.
