Muscat: Sayyid Kamil Bin Fahd Al Saeed, Assistant Secretary General of the Deputy Prime Minister Office for Cabinet Affairs, inaugurated the 'Wave of Arts' Exhibition at the Al Mouz Golf at The Wave, Muscat.

In collaboration with Bait Muzna Gallery, "Wave of the Arts" is the first exhibition to be held at the Sultanate's 18-hole, championship golf course and showcases a collection of contemporary paintings, sculptures and photography by fourteen Arab and international artists.
